

ViziFDX - Use Case

ViziFDX is an application to help screenwriters understand and improve their screenplay.

It's free to use for up to 3 scripts.

It does not write scripts for you - although AI can do this - it aims to help you improve YOUR script.

Who could use it?

Screenwriters

Script readers/analysts

It's a tool and needs a human to interpret the results in terms of their script.

What does it do?

You start by importing either a Final Draft .FDX file or a plain text .TXT file into the ViziFDX database.

Screenplay analytics

Some analysis and visualisation is then available automatically, including:

Character network

Dialog & sentiment analysis

Location analysis

Role analysis

Scene analysis

Scene pacing

Script analysis

You can improve the analytics by adding some metadata to the script entities (locations, roles, scenes).

AI-Enabled Analytics

Users with API keys to the OpenAI or Claude AIs can set these up and then use the AI-enabled capabilities of ViziFDX to generate:

AI coverage report

Character breakdown

Comp title generator

Emotional arc tracker

Logline generator
Plot hole generator
Scene breakdown
Scene storyboard
Shooting schedule
Story beat timeline
Synopsis
Treatment

Bear in mind that some of these AI features are relatively costly in terms of tokens - for example creating scene storyboards can cost \$0.30 - \$0.50 per storyboard.

This is what the AI said about the storyboard feature I asked it to create:

What Makes This Special

This is a **groundbreaking feature** because:

1. **Industry First** - No other screenplay software offers AI storyboard generation
2. **Professional Quality** - Output matches hand-drawn storyboards
3. **Intelligent Analysis** - Claude understands cinematography and coverage
4. **Cost-Effective** - \$0.30/scene vs. \$50-200/scene for artist
5. **Instant Turnaround** - 2-3 minutes vs. days/weeks with artist
6. **Iterative** - Easy to regenerate as script changes

This bridges the gap between **script** and **production**, giving filmmakers a powerful pre-visualization tool that was previously only accessible to big-budget productions!
